THIS WEEKS REFLECTION FROM FR JONATHON

The Feast of the Presentation teaches us important lessons about purity, obedience, and dedication to God. Mary and Joseph followed the law faithfully by bringing Jesus to the Temple, showing their commitment to God's will. This invites all of us to seek the same in our own lives. Purity of heart and obedience are ways to show love for God. By striving for these virtues, we can grow closer to God and live more fully as His children.

Simeon and Anna teach us about waiting for God's promises and trusting in His timing. They spent their lives in prayer and hope, watching for the Messiah. When Jesus arrived, they recognized Him immediately. Their story reminds us to be patient and faithful, even when God's plan seems slow. Simeon and Anna's faith shows us that God is always present, and He will fulfil His promises in His time. The Presentation is also a call to "present" our own lives to God. Just as Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the Temple, we are invited to offer ourselves to God. This can mean letting go of selfishness, sacrificing comfort, or simply placing our lives in His hands. Each small sacrifice is a way of saying "yes" to God, following Mary's example of complete trust and surrender.

As Catholics, we are also called to carry the light of Christ in our daily lives. Jesus is the Light of the World, and we are His followers. Living out His teachings, showing kindness, and spreading hope are ways to share that light with others. Like the candles blessed at Candlemas, we are meant to shine in the world, especially in dark or difficult times. The Presentation of the Lord reminds us that following God often requires faith, patience, and humility. By seeking purity, trusting in His promises, and offering our lives to Him, we follow the example of Mary, Joseph, Simeon, and Anna. Their faithfulness encourages us to live as true disciples, sharing Christ's light with everyone around us.

WE KEEP IN OUR PRAYERS

THE FEAST OF ST BLAISE

The feast of St Blaise takes place on Monday 3rd February. As is customary there will be the blessing of throats at the conclusion of Mass on Monday for all those who wish to have their throats blessed.

BAPTISM PREPARATION MEETING

The next baptism preparation meeting will take place on Monday 3rd February at 7.15pm at St Teresa's. To get your child Baptised, one parent must be a Catholic and you should be living in the parish. If you do not live within our parish you will be asked to speak to your own parish priest for his permission. Please collect a baptism application form from Fr Jonathon after Sunday Mass and bring this along with you to the preparation course. After the completion of the course a date will then be discussed for the Baptism to take place.

PARISH QUIZ NIGHT

We are currently organising another parish quiz night that will take place on Tuesday 25th February at 7.00pm in St Teresa's Hall. This time it will be a team quiz, so bring along your family and friends and enjoy a little bit of friendly competition as we put our knowledge to the test. There is no need to buy any tickets for the evening, as it will be £2 per person on the door. You are warmly invited to bring along your own drinks and snacks. Please do put this date in your diaries and come along for some social time together.

GETTING MARRIED IN 2025/26

If you are thinking about getting married in 2025/26 and haven't yet spoken to Fr Jonathon, to make sure that a Church wedding is possible, please see him as soon as you can. It is important that you give at least six months notice so that enough time is given to arrange all paperwork, especially if overseas contacts are necessary. A Marriage Preparation course must also be attended so that you are fully prepared for the Sacrament.

MASS INTENTIONS

At the Altar the priest offers Mass for the good of the whole Church and for a particular intention. Currently the parish has no Mass intentions booked in during the week. There is nothing better than having a Mass offered for someone, or for a specific intention. Do you want a Mass offered for a particular intention? Perhaps for a deceased relative or friend, or for someone who is sick, or for your own intention? To have a Mass said please fill out a Mass envelope (available in the church porches) and return to Fr Jonathon or place in the offertory collection during Mass.

PARISH GIVING - CHANGE OF BANK ACCOUNT

During the past week the Diocese has set up a new bank account for the parish of Christ the King. Therefore, due to these changes all those who have already set up a standing order to the previous accounts for the parishes will need to cancel it and set up a new standing order. There is letters explaining how to do this for all those who already have a standing order set up. These letters will be given to parishioners this weekend.

This gives us all the opportunity to think about our regular weekly offering to the Church. We believe in a generous God, who longs for us to share that generosity with others. A generous culture is also essential for our parish to develop a sustainable ministry for the future. A DAY WITH THE LORD & A NIGHT OF LIGHT

On Saturday 15th March we will be holding 'A Day with the Lord', which will conclude with 'A Night of Light'. The Day will begin with an opening Mass at 9.00am followed by Exposition throughout the day. In order to make sure that Jesus is never left alone, a sign up sheet for hour slots can be found in the church porches. At 7.30pm we will then move into a Night of Light, where the church will be illuminated by candles leading up towards the Blessed Sacrament. We will be inviting people who are passing by St Teresa's to come into Church, to light a candle or to say a prayer. We will need volunteers to help with this initiative so if you are able to please sign up on the sheet in the church porches where more information can be found.

RAINBOWS BEREAVEMENT SUPPORT



LEARNING MORE ABOUT THE FAITH SACRED & ORDINARY

God makes ordinary things sacred. Water. Bread. Wine. Oil. These are simple items, yet they are transformed by God to impart to human beings the gift of God's own life. These gifts attain their highest purpose through God's transforming action.

We are human beings, which is to say that - unlike the angels we are embodied. Our material nature means that we have need of things we can touch, taste, hear, see, and smell. That is why we need sacraments, which are visible signs of invisible realities.

God reaches us through the material world because that is where we can be reached. God comes to us through the ordinary, and in so doing, the ordinary becomes sacred. The sacraments are privileged moments of encounter, yet Pope Francis reminds us that each moment of our lives is an opportunity to grow in holiness. These moments when we feel God breaking through the ordinary become more apparent when we take time to notice them. You might write down one thing for which you are grateful each day. You might take five minutes to review the day's events to see where God's presence was most apparent.

Over a meal with the ones you love, already a place of sacred encounter, you might converse about how God is acting in each of your lives in ways big and small. Making this a part of your regular family routine can yield big results in terms of seeing God's action bursting through the ordinary because, in large part, we only notice what we are looking for. Put down the phone. Make time for silence. Take a walk. Look one another in the eye. It is through the world that God comes to us. It is our task to watch for God there and to listen for his voice.


God is always inviting us. We are called to the Lord's table and to the dinner table, to the waters of Baptism and the water we pour for the one in need. We are called to recognise that we are always in the presence of God.
