Safeguarding

It has been brought to our attention that some of our children are using social media platforms as a way of communicating with friends, however, we ask parents to be aware of what their child is using and sharing. As part of our safeguarding within school, we teach children about online safety and our Year 6 class will take part in a session with our safeguarding team next week.

Road Safety/Travelling to School

As the darker mornings and evenings are approaching, please discuss with your children how to keep safe when travelling to and from school. If your child comes to school on a bike/scooter, please could you remind them to wear a helmet, lights/reflective clothing and to follow road safety rules. Members of the public have reported that a few of our children have been seen putting themselves at risk near/on roads.

As part of our school curriculum, we teach all children about road safety, and our Year 3 children will take part in pedestrian/road safety sessions after half term. More details will be sent to the Year 3 class.
